

Instructions for the use and maintenance of the SIDIZ conference chair

These instructions provide information on the design, cleaning and maintenance of the SIDIZ conference chair. The chair fulfils the demanding conditions for office use. All parts of the chair with which the user can come into contact have been designed to prevent personal injury or damage to property. The chairs have been subjected to intensive testing at test establishments and they meet the requirements of international standards ČSN EN 1335-1,2 and 3. The upholstery fabric used on the seat and backrest meets international requirements for fire resistance, wear resistance and colour fastness in the highest category.

Description

The SIDIZ conference chair has fixed black plastic armrests, an upholstered seat and mesh fabric backrest. The seat and backrest are firmly connected to the steel frame, which has plastic glides to protect floor coverings.

Principles for use

- The correct performance of the conference chair depends on its use in an appropriate office environment with respect to humidity, Dust content and correct handling (rough handling may result in damage);
- Seating should be protected from excessive humidity, temperature and direct sunlight;
- The upholstery should not come into contact with the sharp edges of other furnishings;
- The upholstery can be cleaned with a vacuum cleaner or brush;
- The metal and plastic parts of the chair can be cleaned with standard non-abrasive detergents diluted with water. Do not use any organic or non-organic solvents!
- Plastic parts of the chair can be treated with standard non-abrasive furniture polishes;
- Any liquids spilt on the chair should be immediately wiped up;
- To remove stains use a dilute soap-based cleaning fluid (max. 30°C). Use a damp cloth to ensure the entire chair is not soaked. Then dry carefully;
- We recommend using environmentally friendly cleaning agents;
- The chairs should be used for their intended purpose – seating in an office environment;
- Other methods of use, including standing on the chair or sitting on the armrests, may result in injury, or damage to the chair.
